## Recommendations On Developing a CIT Case Management Program

## How do I get started?

- 1. Forming a relationship with a local law enforcement agency.
  - Based on your needs, establish a monthly mental health consortium with local law enforcement, District Attorney's office and local treatment organizations.
- 2. Gather mental health/substance use call data.
- 3. After data compilation, assess your need.
- 4. Research and locate funding source(s), such as the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG).
- 5. Secure funding and begin the hiring process.

I've secured funding and hired staff, now what?

- 1. Introductions to the entire patrol unit (i.e., briefings).
- 2. Familiarizing newly hired CIT staff with internal programs (e.g., school-based, intensive, trauma, Veteran's, etc).
- 3. Familiarizing CIT staff with external resources (e.g., food banks, housing, etc).
- 4. Integration into law enforcement agency (e.g., ride alongs, shadow SROs).
- 5. Implement easy referral process.
- 6. Positive reinforcement system (e.g., candy on your desk).
- 7. Providing positive feedback to deputies (e.g., correct referrals, community feedback).
- 8. Success = presence. Avoid out of sight, out of mind mentality by establishing an office (or two) in the law enforcement agency.
