What is a Disaster

- An event that causes serious loss, destruction, hardship, unhappiness, or death.
- Examples include tornado, hurricane, flood, terrorist event, pandemic, blizzard or winter storm.

Disaster Response, Operations, and Assumptions

- Every disaster is different.
- Trauma affects individuals and the community.
- Response strategy depends on disaster characteristics.
- A disaster causes disruptions and changes.
- Everyone that experiences a disaster is affected by it.



Disaster Response, Operations, and Assumptions

- The severity of reactions is affected by the type of, level of exposure to, and casualties associated with the disaster.
- Prior mental illness or substance abuse can play a factor.

Individuals Reactions

- Physical
- Emotional
- Cognitive
- Behavioral
- Spiritual



Physical Reactions

- Gastrointestinal problems
- Headaches, aches, and pains
- Weight change
- Sweating or chills
- Tremors
- Clumsiness
- Increased tension
- Sleep Disturbance



Emotional Reactions

- · Heroic euphoric, or invulnerable
- Denial
- Anxiety or fear
- Depression
- Guilt
- Apathy
- Grief



Cognitive Reactions

- Disorientation and confusion
- Poor concentration
- Difficulty setting priorities or making decisions
- Loss of objectivity
- Nightmare or flashbacks
- Preoccupation with the disaster



Behavioral Reactions

- Change in activity level
- Alcohol and drug use or abuse
- Increased use of medications
- Difficulty communicating or listening
- Irritability and anger
- Crying
- Inability to sleep
- Avoidance of triggering places or activities



Spiritual Reactions

- May assist some survivors with coping and resilience.
- May cause some survivors to question their beliefs and life structures.



Pandemic

A PANDEMIC IS AN EPIDEMIC OF AN INFECTIOUS DISEASE THAT HAS SPREAD ACROSS A LARGE REGION AFFECTING A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF PEOPLE.

Characteristics

- DIFFERENT FROM OTHER NATURAL DISASTERS IN THAT THERE IS NO DEFINED BEGINNING OR END.
- CAN NOT SEE OR TOUCH THE PERCEIVED THREAT.
- DURATION IS GENERALLY 18-24 MONTHS.
- SLOW MOVING
- MASS FATALITIES
- FEAR

- STAY CONNECTED TO YOUR SOCIAL SUPPORTS VIRTUALLY
- EXERCISE
- FUEL YOUR BODY WITH HEALTHY CHOICES
- MEDITATION

- DISCOVER NEW HOBBIES
- READ
- LISTEN TO MUSIC
